Summary Statutes

The Sen Foundation for Research and Education in International Cooperation Foundation was established on December 4, 2009.

Art. 2.1. Its purpose is, in particular, research and education for the benefit of developing countries and the global issues related to their poverty problems, and furthermore the performance of all that is related to the foregoing or may be conducive thereto, all in the broadest sense.

Art.2.2 The foundation serves the public interest. 2.3 It has no profit motive.

2.4 The foundation tries to achieve its goal by, among other things, carrying out research assignments of official and private organizations for humanitarian aid and international cooperation, publishing research results as well as giving courses and lectures.

5.1 The board consists of at least 3 members to be appointed and dismissed by the board. The Board shall determine the number of its members.

5.2 When appointing board members, the board will ensure that no close relationship, such as blood or affinity up to and including the fourth degree, marriage, registered partnership or cohabitation exists between the members of the board, or that the persons between whom such a relationship exists do not constitute more than 1/3 of the board members.

5.3 The board shall elect from among its members a chairman, a secretary and a treasurer. The positions of secretary and treasurer may be held by one person.

5.4 Board members shall be appointed for a period of 3 years. The board shall draw up a retirement schedule. A retiring board member is eligible for immediate reappointment. A board member is eligible for reappointment up to a maximum of two times.

5.6 Should the board consist of less than the established number of members, it shall remain competent.

5.7 No remuneration or attendance fees shall be paid to members of the board. Reimbursement of expenses shall be permitted.

6.4 The board shall decide by an absolute majority of the votes cast. The board may also take decisions outside a meeting provided that all board members vote in favor of the proposal in writing.7 The foundation shall be represented by the board as well as by two board members acting jointly including the chairman.

11.4 The board shall adopt and periodically update a policy plan.

N.B. The foundation is recognized by the Dutch government as a general interest-serving organization. Donations to the foundation are deductible from the donor's taxable income. NB 2. By board decision in 2021, it was determined that the foundation's activities should be concentrated on issues related to the security of Europe in a broad sense, i.e. also the areas surrounding it. In a broad sense also means that these also concern issues of human, social and state security.
